


#### LADIES BOOK CLUB Fri, Apr 4 | 10:30 am





Safety at St. Thomas UMC is the responsibility of everyone! To help with this critical mission, the Church Council has created a Safety Committee. The role of the Safety Committee is to build a culture of Safety and Situational Awareness with everyone here at the Church. To achieve this goal, the Safety Committee is tasked with developing and implementing strategies that both enhance our safety and are a good fit for St. Thomas with regard to our history and available resources. For example, you may have noticed the exterior doors have been numbered to assist First Responders to quickly identify the location of an incident and the appropriate entry point. The Safety Committee takes an ALL-HAZARDS approach. This means we look at all things that put us at risk from intruders, weather, medical, fires, etc. Our responsibilities include Conducting Safety Audits, Emergency Response Preparedness, Access to Training Opportunities and Communication on these important matters to our church family.
