

It's Time to Wake Up

Advent is here and it is officially "count-down" time. The very moment we put away all the Thanksgiving leftovers in the refrigerator, Black Friday begins. And, on Black Friday comes the count-down of the diminishing days until Christmas. I once had a neighbor who had a snowman on his porch that held a lighted electronic sign that counted down the number of days until Christmas. Every time I passed by it I was reminded of how many days there were to get my shopping done. When it reached seven days or less, I began to panic. The countdown was exciting but it induced in me an anxiety that I wouldn't be ready in time for Christmas.

The church has its own "countdown to Christmas." It is called "The Season of Advent." Instead of being a time of shopping for Christmas gifts, Advent is a time of preparation for the gift of a miraculous presence. This "preparation" is not about decking the halls or trimming the tree. This "preparation" is not about baking cookies or wrapping packages. This "preparation" is about a truth which comes into the world, it's about love cradled in a feeding trough. Advent is an alarm clock, a moment of truth to rouse

us out of the "get-by and keep-going" stupor of this world and wake up, to share the story of Christ's coming. Advent is a time to wake up our spirits so that we can be aware of God's presence in our lives and in the lives of others. Advent comes with the invitation to open our hearts and minds to the arrival of the Christ. If Jesus knocks on the door of our lives, we want to be ready and awake enough to invite him in. Wake up then for Jesus wants to enter in! Wake up for Jesus is our Emmanuel – God with us!

The extraordinary good news of Advent is that God chooses to be with us. God enters into our world desiring a relationship with us. The bad news is that we are often unaware of this miracle. The season of Advent can be a time when we take Jesus' call to "wake up" to heart. We can turn away from the busyness of this season, with all its shopping, wrapping, and decking the halls, so that we can look for God in the people and the places all around us. Here is a plan for Advent: Wake up! Be ready, and look for the God who promises to come to us in love.


