We delivered 115 Senior gifts to Manassas Health and Rehab




We served 39 families with 117 children through our Angel Shop


Finally, the Mission Council donated \$1000 worth of Winter Coats to Loch Lomond Elementary School!

Living Nativity

For the second year in a row due to the impact of the pandemic, the Drive Thru Living Nativity was presented in a shortened form. We hosted five scenes (four "living" murals plus the choir) and offered the drive-thru for only two hours. However, that did not prevent 169 cars with 521 people from coming through and enjoying key scenes of the story of Jesus' birth. The weather did not cooperate with the originally scheduled date, so the event was presented on Sunday, Dec. 12. Much credit goes to the actors and the setup crews for being able to move from one day to another rather seamlessly. We were fortunate that Pastor Arum was able to make arrangements for animals at the last minute, as the original menagerie could not make our secondary date. Two goats and two donkeys filled the bill this year. In another step toward normalcy, Frank and the kitchen crew provided soup and sandwiches for the actors between their scenes - social distancing did apply. Whew! What a whirlwind of activity took place in the Fellowship Hall and Kitchen between Dec. 14th and Dec. 24th as we prepped for the annual Christmas Day Dinner. We had some of our turkeys smoked by Don Haines this year-what a wonderful treat! The rest of the turkeys were baked and then hams and turkeys were prepped for serving, potatoes were peeled and cooked, stuffing was made, and dessert containers were filled. We also prepped some of the main meals for the early morning deliveries. Christmas morning we had more people help getting the food into the containers for our curbside service. Volunteers came by 10:30 to take food to our first responders and homebound sweethearts. If we counted correctly we served 1,949 people. Of those, 630 were delivered to first responders plus we made an additional 281 boxed desserts for the hospital. A special thank you to Connie Santee for coordinating our deliveries. We have the best cleanup crew around! We would like to thank everyone who helped IN SOME WAY with the Christmas Day Dinner. We couldn't do it without YOU! 

Bi-District Leadership Training Day

The Alexandria and Arlington Districts will host its annual Bi-District Training Day (BDTD) on January 15, 2022. This year's event will take place virtually, and registration is now open to all of the Virginia Conference.



BDTD speakers offer training sessions and workshops in a multitude of ministry areas to help attendees learn and grow. This year's event will feature the Rev. Michael Beck (pictured left), author of Fresh Expressions in a Digital Age: How the Church Can Prepare for a Post Pandemic World and Contextual Intelligence: Unlocking the Ancient Secret to Mission on the Front Lines.

Bi-District Training Day will be online only in 2022, with a wide variety of topics. The cost is \$30 for a "day of pass" and \$50 for an "all access pass" that allows viewing of all sessions through July 2022. Participants can choose from 66 workshops — in-

cluding three live sessions with Michael Beck and five live Zoom lunchtime conversations for networking and fellowship. Prerecorded content from more than 50 speakers will be available. The event covers topics in 23 different categories. If you want to learn or grow to help your church and community, there's a session for you!

Hospitality Work Stream Groups

The apostle, Peter, writes to encourage us in 1 Peter 4:8 – 10, "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms."

It's time to recognize our God-ordained need for people, and then seek to build relationships with the people God already has placed in our life.



Back in October, many of the leaders of the church came together for our annual Leadership Summit. We began to discern a need to begin a longer conversation about the ways we might offer radical hospitality to one another and to those in our midst we may have intentionally or unintentionally overlooked previously.

So, beginning in January, we're going to create four Hospitality Work Stream Groups that will meet for about 6 months to a year. Here are the people we'd like to do a better job of welcoming into our community:

- Young adults
- Those experiencing economic hardship
- Non-natives and/or those for whom English is a second language
- LGBTQ+ individuals and/or families with LGBTQ+ members

These are folks that are already a part of our community in some way and we'd like to build on this intentionally. So, we're asking you to prayerfully discern whether you'd like to join one of these groups for a longer conversation. This is not a top down approach. We don't have a set of expectations or outcomes in mind.

What we do plan to do is to ground ourselves in the Word of God. We plan to pray and invite the Holy Spirit to guide our conversation. We are going to listen well to one another, and we're going to pray some more. We might seek out expert knowledge or take time to learn more if a group feels like they need this.

Then, each work group will make some practical recommendations to the Church Council for best practices we'd like to put into place going forward. Each work stream will have a subject expert and a key leader who will share what's being learned and discerned with the Council – who will help ensure we create a safe space for conversation and will convene the particular work group. 
Children's Ministry
